



Why Study Prophecy?

6. Prophecy is a tool for evangelism.


7. Prophecy helps protect people from heresy.

10. Prophecy proves the truth of God's Word.


#### Old Testament Structure








- Daniyèl or Daniel = "God Is My Judge"

- "young men in whom there was no blemish, but good-looking and gifted in all wisdom, possessing knowledge and quick to understand" (1:4)

- Belteshazzar = "Bel Protect His Life" (see 1:7; 4:8)




Daniel, Michelangelo Buonarroti, 1511

- Served Nebuchadnezzar and Darius




Daniel, Michelangelo Buonarroti, 1511

- Life characterized by faith, prayer, courage, consistency, and lack of compromise




Daniel, Michelangelo Buonarroti, 1511

- Mentioned 3x by Ezekiel




*Daniel,* Michelangelo Buonarroti, 1511

### Authorship Affirmation




- Jewish Talmud agrees thatDaniel was the author





- Persian and Greek words



- Darius the Mede (5:31; 6:1) = Gubaru




Nabonidus Cylinder, Sippar, (556-539)







## Purpose

## Key Verse

## Key Verse


"He reveals deep and secret things; he knows what is in the darkness, and light dwells with Him." (2:20–22)

## Key Verse

"And in the days of these kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom which shall never be destroyed; and the kingdom shall not be left to other people; it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand forever." (2:44)

## Key Chapter: 9

- Prophecy of the Seventy Weeks (9:24–27)
- First sixty-nine weeks were fulfilled at Christ's first coming
- Seventieth week

#### Contribution to the Bible

#### Contribution

- Ezekiel's emphasis: Israel's religious restoration
- Daniel's emphasis: Israel's political restoration
- Placed in the Writings, rather than the Prophets



## Christ in Daniel



The Great Stone crushing the kingdoms of this world (2:34-35, 44)

The Son of Man who is given dominion by the Ancient of Days (7:13–14)

The coming Messiah who will be cut off (9:25–26)

Daniel's vision in 10:5-9

#### Vision of the 69 Weeks

- Decree (9:25) took place onMarch 4, 444 B.C. (Neh.2:1-8)
- years

  69 weeks x 7 years = 483
- = 173,880 days (360 day yr.)
- March 29, A.D. 33(Triumphal Entry)

#### Vision of the 69 Weeks

- 444 B.C. to A.D. 33 = 476 years
- 476 x 365.24219 days peryear = 173,855 days
- + 25 for the difference between March 4 and March 29 = 173,880 days




